On Sunday, we had a combined church service on our compound. Our 3 churches in Beira came together for the last time this year and it was a very special morning. I had an opportunity to thank the people for their wonderful support during the year.

It thrilled me to see our Prayer House full with people and to sense a tangible presence of God.

The youth, mums and children from each of the churches performed items, which is an integral part of a Mozambican church service. The youth from Manga church and Massamba churches performed dramas and songs that the YWAM team had performed earlier in the year. Emma with Tukita and a very delicious looking cake

It brought tears to my eyes to see that even though it has

been 4 months since the team left, their ministry, the Lord's ministry, lives on to impact the city of Beira. I will be making arrangements for the youth to perform the songs at other churches in Beira in the near future.

In the last couple of weeks, a few men and women from my church have been extending the walls of our building. At the moment, we are putting new bamboo and reeds on the church walls and our next stage of development will be to put new plastic and reeds on the roof ready for the heavy rains of the wet season. It is exciting to know that the church has financed all this work from weekly offerings.

Our school is closed for holidays but before I leave I have the job of choosing teachers for next year. We are planning to increase the number of classes we had this year and also increase the number of year levels that operate. I will be relying heavily on the recommendations of our school principal with this task.

I will be leaving just in time before the extreme heat and rain comes to Beira. However I won't miss out because I will be returning in early January when it is still hot and very wet.

What am I looking forward to about coming back for a few weeks?

Seeing my family and friends mostly ... oh how I've missed you all.

Getting my hair cut and coloured ... yes please!!

Having a massage ... to get rid of all the knots in my back.

Driving on smooth roads ... it will be a dream!

Walking on carpet ... it has been 9 months since these toes of mine touched something soft and furry.

Being able to go to the toilet without leaving the house ... now we're getting personal.

Being able to walk down the street without having to step over or around piles of smelly rubbish ... an unreal thought.

Getting lots of hugs from people ... over here the usual greeting is a handshake but I have started to hug my church ladies and they love it!

Having to obey the road rules when I am driving ... it will be quite a novelty really.

And most of all ... knowing it will be only 7 weeks till I get to see all my friends again back here in Beira ... I love them so much!
