On the way in to Lomego village, I met the Chief, Mr Boscolo. After stating my purpose for being there, we agreed to meet again after discussing things with the church.

I approached a bright young man who was interpreting and reading the word from Portuguese to Sena and **put to him the idea of being a teacher if he could fulfil the criteria.** He was educated to grade 7 and basically jobless. He is the church evangelist a real leader and full of energy.

The pastor who led the initial interests and gathered names of **130 potential students.** He brought with him his **church secretary who had completed grade 5 and attends Bible College on Saturdays.** and is also very keen to be a teacher.

Together we returned to the Chief. He agreed that there was a **definite need for the rural**

education program. It was made clear that the village would have to provide a building, teachers wages and the children's materials. This caused him to pause and what looked like a change of heart actually became a **"Do you want to look at the sight we will build the school on?"** We immediately rose to see this site. It was perfect. Cleared. Right next to their community hall/hut. Located under many big shady trees. The pastor agreed heartily.

Naturally there are many details to work thorough but essentially, training begins in two weeks, to get the teachers ready to **begin their school.**
